

The **Michelin House** building commissioned by the Michelin Tyre Company Ltd as their British Headquarters in 1909 is a stunning Art Noveau London landmark.

In 1985 the building was bought by Sir Terence Conran and Paul Hamlyn and they undertook an extensive restoration of the building, reinstating many of it's original features. Aspects in relation to the history of the building have been retained and several refer directly to the history of the building, the Bibendum and his corpulent profile, the **Michelin Man**. The building now houses the Bibendum restaurant and Oyster bar, a retail area and offices.
