THE BRIEF

In our first collaboration with Scott Osborn, Hurst Joinery Projects was commissioned to manufacture and install various joinery elements for the refurbishment of the ground floor of Salisbury House, a Grade II listed building in the heart of London.

The client required joinery elements for the communal areas, conference rooms, meeting rooms, and reception areas with the vision of creating beautiful work zones for the building's occupants to utilise. The challenge lay in blending the historical charm of the building with modern design elements, ensuring that each interior space could strike a balance between aesthetics and practicality.

Hurst was selected for the project due to its expertise in delivering quality craftsmanship in joinery solutions for commercial spaces.


